Students are recognised for their work in a range of categories including Academic Excellence, Arts excellence, Sporting Excellence and Service to the community. Please ensure you have read the criteria, eligibility and nomination process for the awards.

Grade Point Average (GPA) – Levels of achievement are converted to a number and averaged across all subjects for each reporting juncture specified (A=5, B=4, C=3, D=2, E=1). GPAs are expressed as a number between 0 and 5, to two decimal places.
